IFIAR issues Report on the 2017 Global Inspections Findings Survey Johannesburg/ 12 March 2018

The International Forum of Independent Audit Regulators (IFIAR) recently issued its report on the sixth annual survey of inspection findings. The Global Inspections Findings Survey report is based on information collected in two categories of activities namely, inspections performed on firm-wide systems of quality control and inspections of individual audit engagements. Forty-two IFIAR members contributed to the 2017 survey.

IFIAR members reported in the 2017 survey that 40% of audit engagements inspected had at least one finding, compared to 42% in the 2016 survey and to 47% in the first survey capturing this percentage (2014 survey).

Although the frequency of findings from inspections of individual audit engagements has reduced on an overall basis compared to the last survey, progress is not experienced in all jurisdictions or at the same rate. Further, no definitive trends have been noted for findings arising from inspections of firm-wide systems of quality control.
